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Summary

“This is a well conceptualized, prepared, and presented R-PP. The approach to readiness captured here appears to be appropriate to addressing the major drivers of degradation and generating economic opportunities. (...) The text is thorough and especially well documented. It takes care of the related policy and legislative framework of the country and the wider aim of developing Chile’s pathway towards a low carbon economy that includes as a major element the forest sector. The focus on degradation will likely provide many useful lessons for others seeking to focus on the second D in REDD+.”
