1. SUMMARY OF REPORT

SUMMARY:

The Vanuatu REDD+ Program was fortunate to access the Readiness Fund of the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility ("FCPF"), pursuant to which the World Bank agreed to provide to the Recipient a grant for formulating the Readiness Preparation Proposal ("R-PP"). The R-PP was then approved by the World Bank; Participants Committee of the FCPF. Accordingly, the PC, through its Resolution PC/14/2013/8, decided to allocate grant funding to the Recipient in the amount of up to three million six hundred thousand Dollars (US\$ 3, 600,000)("Grant"), to enable it to move ahead with preparation for readiness.

Given the Grant Agreement was signed, and that the project fund is rolling in, the project now began with the implementation of the preparation phase of the project; rather on a slow mode but it will eventually speed up very soon as the Projects Officer like the Technical Specialist and the Communication Officer recruited soon.

The R-PP Roadmap includes all activities necessary for Vanuatu to achieve a state of REDD+ Readiness. The FCPF Grant committed was US\$3.6 million over a period of three years (2015 to 2018) to finance a subset of mentioned in the R-PP. The Readiness Preparation Grant will finance key elements of the R-PP Roadmap and prepare Vanuatu to engage in and benefit from a future performance-based system from REDD+. In particular, it will fund three components, which aim to:

- Strengthen existing institutions for REDD+ at the national and decentralized level through the
 establishment and operation of a Vanuatu National REDD+ Unit, support to the REDD+ Technical
 Committee, support to the NAB and its PMU, as well as the set-up of Provincial REDD+
 Committees,
- Strengthen the stakeholder engagement at the decentralized level, including the assessment and strengthening of existing FGRMs for REDD+, and
- Develop a National REDD+ strategy, its implementation framework and the ESMF are developed and validated by a broad spectrum of national stakeholders through the SESA. These activities will also strengthen existing forest policy and management systems, information and data, participatory methods and human and institutional capacity, which will directly support the sustainable management and development of Vanuatu's forests.

Thanks to the World Bank Mission who visited Vanuatu on May 25-29. The objective of the World Bank Team mission were to: conduct an operational kick-off workshop, covering fiduciary, safeguards and technical aspects; Review with the Government the overall status of project activities and identify any bottlenecks that may prevent rapid implementation of the project; Review annual work programs and budgets and provide technical advice to the implementing agency; Review the procurement and financial

management aspects of the project and provide relevant advice; and Review the safeguards aspects of the project and provide relevant advice.

The progress activities and achievements carried out so far include;

- FCPF Grant and Project launching 26 May 2015
- REDD+ Unit Establishment and recruitment advertisement of Technical Specialist Post and Extension and Outreach Officer Post
- Procurement began process to procure equipment
- First portion of grant is now in the account ready to be used
- DoF commitment allocated fellow staffs to assist
- Work is underway to establish a platform with NGO, CSO to be able to be part in implementing the RPP there is a need to engage them
- Currently working on the TORS Analytical studies, SESA
- Working with Live & Learn on Technical Committee TOR and finalizing REDD+ Key messaging

In work undertaken by partner grants outside of the FCPF funding, Live & Learn Vanuatu in partnership with Conservation International has been working to capacity build VANGO to establish a Civil Society Platform for REDD+. An initial meeting was held in June 2015.

Since this time VANGO has been unable to organise a training workshop. LLV has been asked to facilitate a workshop itself which will be done on 27th-28th August 2015.

Live & Learn Vanuatu is planning a provincial strengthening trip in September and looking forward to the recruitment of the REDD+ Unit to ensure that the trip is of value.

During provincial meeting it was interesting and rewarding to note that the local authorities and community are aware of the impact of Climate Change to their live and there is discussion of REDD+ related measures such as Reforestation, Conservation and Protection of the forests resources.

Department of forests officers stationed in the islands are informed briefly on the REDD+ program and they were able to support the community members and farmers with information to continue to care for their forest resources and to maintain the way of live to relay on the forest resources for livelihood.

3. PROGRESS AT R-PP sub component level

3.1. REDD Readiness Progress

As a synthesis of the following output level assessments, please briefly describe here the progress made during the reporting period in developing the country Readiness Package (FCPF M&E Framework Indicator 1.A.): up to 300 words, if applicable

Progress made during the reporting period in developing the country Readiness Package:

Vanuatu presented its Readiness Preparation Proposal in March of 2013 at the World Bank FCPF Participants Committee authorized grant funding of US\$ 3.6 million (about half of the total estimated budget of USD \$ 7.3 million).

On the 26th May of 2015 Vanuatu successfully got the Grant Agreement Signed in Port Vila, Vanuatu by the Vanuatu Government and World Bank FCPF REDD+ program.

Vanuatu REDD+ program had been progressing well in late 2014 to early 2015 leading up to the signing of the Grant Agreement between the World Bank and Vanuatu Government. With the devastating damage to the country by the category 5 tropical cyclone 5 the country a national state of emergency was imposed and all efforts were towards recovery. These had directly and indirectly have effect to the progress of the REDD+ program in the country.

The Project Management Unit (PMU) of the Climate Change office in Vanuatu had continued to support the facilitation of the REDD+ Unit and effective to recruit the Consultants for the procurement and this has been a great support for the Vanuatu REDD+ program in getting the activities moving. Department of forests now organized itself in getting the REDD+ Unit to take on the Implementation of the FCPF funded activities as listed out in the recent May World Bank Aid Memoir.

The report was prepared basically with the Department of forests taking the lead and with guidance from the representative of the Technical Committee. The Vanuatu REDD+ Unit is progressing in its setting up. In the next few days soon as the Vanuatu REDD+ Unit is in place and operating that more information regarding the progress of the Vanuatu REDD+ program will be compiled for the next progress reporting.

The annual progress country reporting expected to be submitted to the FMT by August 15th but the Vanuatu REDD+ reporting was delayed and it is hoped that the FMT will consider the circumstance Vanuatu is in and accept the late submission.

4. ISSUES, CHALLENGES AND RISKS

The Challenge in progressing towards the intended REDD+ results are:					
It was difficult to find personals for recruiting to the REDD+ Unit causing much delay in the recruitment of the REDD+ Unit.					
The delay in accessing funds does mean that much of the activities were delayed.					
Government's commitment needed be more emphasised to the REDD+ project.					
More support is needed to get the NGOs active involvement in the REDD+ readiness process.					
General understanding of the public towards the REDD+ project for the process of Readiness Phase and Carbon is still limited.					
Soon the REDD+ team are recruited much of the project may be moving quicker.					

5. MAIN LESSONS LEARNED

There was much learned and yet to learn for since the beginning of the readiness process. It is important the Procedures and Criteria are followed and this is a rather great challenge for Vanuatu when to compare the circumstance for Vanuatu. Support that is provided by the World Bank personals were much appreciated and it was clear to the REDD+ team in Vanuatu that the FCPF program for Vanuatu is fortunate great persons willing to support the program. Vanuatu Government while is keen to participate in the REDD+ program do realized that it is a process and that the National Policies and Programs are in support of the REDD+ program. There is one great realization that pool of expert consultants in Vanuatu and the Region is limited and that it is not easy to acquire to support the National REDD+ program. Urgent need to getting the REDD+ Unit set up is needed soon to implement the Readiness Preparation Proposal activities in the Components. Local Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) and CSOs in Vanuatu do need as much support from the Vanuatu REDD+ program to be able to position themselves to actively participate in the REDD+ program.
