Overall progress

Mozambique has made significant and demonstrable progress towards achieving the objectives of the FCPF REDD+ Readiness grant



Objective of the FCPF Grant

Objective:

• The Project Development Objective is to contribute to the adoption of **national REDD+ Strategy** and of the national legal and institutional framework for REDD+.

• Grant Components:

- Strengthening the national readiness management arrangements
- Promotion of multi-stakeholder consultations
- Design of the National REDD+ Strategy



FCPF Grant Status: Component 1

• Strengthening the National Readiness Management Arrangements:

- The UT-REDD+ team is now composed by 8 people at the national level and 2 at the province level.
- National Steering Committee (Comite Tecnico de Revisao) was created by a national decree
 and they have been having regular meetings. This committee is composed by members of the
 government and civil society organizations.

• Stakeholders Consultation and Participation:

- There has been broad dissemination and public consultation of REDD+ at both national and provincial level, with a focus on the provinces where the pilot projects are being prepared;

Communication Activities:

Information and communication material about REDD+ was prepared and distributed
 (pamphlets, policy briefings, radio and TV material, cartoon, etc), and a website was created.

FCPF Grant Status: Component 2

- Design of the National REDD+ Strategy:
 - Technical Studies completed or ongoing: i)Drivers of deforestation and degradation and strategic options to address those drivers; ii) Analysis of the Institutional and Legal Framework, including the Benefit Sharing Mechanism; iii)Definition of forest;
 - Feeding into the FIP Investment Plan
 - → Draft REDD+ Strategy to be presented at the Paris COP
- Safeguards:
 - Strategic Environmental Social Assessment including the Environmental (SESA) and Social Management Framework (ESMF) prepared by Dec 2015;
 - Resettlement Policy Framework (RPF) and the Grievance Redress Mechanism prepared by March 2016.



FCPF Grant Status: Component 2 (cont)

Preparation of the Landscapes Projects:

- The Zambézia Integrated Landscape Management Program: ER-PIN presented at the Brussel Carbon Fund meeting, and approved. Analytical and technical studies have been commissioned and are under preparation. FIP funds will finance part of the investment phase.
- The Cabo Delgado Integrated Landscape Management Program: Analytical and technical studies have been commissioned. FIP funds will finance part of the investment phase.



FCPF Grant Status: Component 3 & 4

- Forest monitoring activities (MRV) and establishment of the level of references (REL)
 - UT-REDD+ is liaising with the National Forest Inventory Department at MITADER, and JICA in developing the Forest Information Platform.
 - JICA proving technical training for GoM staff. They are also performing a national forest inventory and REL for 2 provinces. JICA, the GoM and the WB discussed on aligning efforts to finalize the forest inventory for the whole country, and the REL.
 - Meetings with various government actors, donors, academia, and civil society have been conducted to better understand the capacity already installed in the country for the creation of an MRV system.
 - → There is a need to develop the REL and the MRV



Financial Reporting

- Grant amount: US\$ 3.8 Million
- Disbursed (by June 30, 2015): 49%
- Commitment(by June 30, 2015): 70%
