About this document

This template is for use by Readiness Fund (RF) REDD+ Country Participants to report their annual progress on REDD+ readiness activities in general, and on FCPF-supported activities in particular. Report preparation

Reports cover progress through 30th June of each year.

COMPONENT 1A. NATIONAL REDD+ MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

- Capacity strengthening of the National REDD+ Secretariat staff, including on operational and procurement aspects. Experts recruited on: MRV, Stakeholder Engagement and National and International consultants to support on operational matters.
- Setting-up of State Level REDD+ Secretariats in Ondo and Nasarawa States. The State REDD+ ensures the coordination of the various REDD+ pilot site activities in the state and interfacing with relevant ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs) at the State levels. The State Level REDD+ Secretariat in the states oversees the activities of the local governments, NGOs, civil society, academia, the private sector, local communities, and traditional authorities working in the field of environment, forestry and natural resource management.
- Self-assessment of progress in REDD+ Readiness and presentation of Mid-Term Progress Report at PA10/PC24 in September 25-29 at Lao PDR. Three participants represented the Nigeria REDD+ Programme.
- Study to inform the set-up of a Feedback and Grievance Redress Mechanism finalized.

- Meeting of the Programme Steering Committee (PSC) in May 2018 which brought together different organisations/agencies such as the: National Project Coordinator, Nigeria Erosion and Watershed Management Project (NEWMAP); Hon. Commissioner for Environment, Nasarawa State; Chairman, Cross River State, Forestry Commission; Permanent Secretary, CRS Ministry of Climate Change and Forestry; Special Assistant to Senate President, on Environmental issues; Representative of Federal Ministry of Agriculture; Representative of Federal Ministry of Finance; Representative of Department of Climate Change; Representative of National Space Research and Development Agency (NARSDA); Representative of Federal Department of Forestry; Representative of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), etc. The total number of participants was 38 (male 31 and female 7).
- The PSC resolved and approved to: the process for selecting additional States to the REDD+ Programme, reinforcing the capacity of the National and State REDD+ Secretariats, and more actively integrating gender considerations into Readiness activities.

COMPONENT 1B. CONSULTATION, PARTICIPATION AND OUTREACH;

• Consultations with communities' leaders, Community Based Organisations (CBOs) and other relevant stakeholders on the National Forest Inventory (NFI) was conducted. Communities are actively involved in field data collection, including the measurement of forest carbon.

COMPONENT 2. REDD+ STRATEGY PREPARATION

- Launch of the process for developing the National REDD+ Strategy. Inception Report presented to the main REDD+ stakeholders in June 2018.
- The development of the SESA and the safeguards instruments is on-going. Field data collection completed. Draft report ready awaiting validation.

COMPONENT 3; REFERENCE EMISSION LEVEL/REFERENCE LEVEL

- The National Forest Inventory (NFI) is currently being implemented in Nigeria to capture the value of the forest for the purpose of establishing a national forest reference emission level/forest reference level (FREL/FRL) for REDD+ in Nigeria. To this effect, the following has been achieved:
 - Practical field training for data collection, Akure, Ondo State, 11th to 15th December 2017.
 Participants 67 (11 female and 58 male).
 - Training workshop on Forest Emissions Level and land cover mapping using FAO SEPAL cloud-based software, Abuja, 5th to 9th March 2018. Participants 47 (5 female and 42 male)
 - High-level sensitization workshops to Forest Service authorities (Directors of Forestry) in 27 States, raising awareness ahead of the NFI. 26- 27 April, 2018. Participants – 110 (16 female and 94 male)
 - Practical Training Workshop on Forest Inventory (Carbon) Techniques and Data Collection Akure Ondo State, Nigeria 14th to 18th May 2018. Participants – 40 (6 female and 34 male).
 - Sensitization meetings with local communities in Ondo State, prior to launching the NFI.
 - Ongoing work on the production of updated land cover/land use map for Nigeria by Remote Sensing/GIS Consultant.
 - Training Workshop on Land Cover mapping, Change Detection and Accuracy assessment using FAO SEPAL and Collect Earth Software in Nigeria. [16th to 20th July 2018]

COMPONENT 4a; NATIONAL FOREST MONITORING SYSTEM

• No activities to report on as of yet, as this is pending other deliverables.

COMPONENT 4b; INFORMATION SYSTEM FOR MULTIPLE BENEFITS, OTHER IMPACTS, GOVERNANCE AND SAFEGUARDS

- Launch of Communication tool kits. The kits focus on how best to use communication to engage various target groups. It also provides guides for the Stakeholder's use in providing straightforward explanations through examples and exercises that resonate with local realities in the Program target areas/states.
- Launch of the process to develop a benefit-sharing mechanism. Field visits completed. Validation workshop done.

2. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related achievements in your country during the last year?

- For example, x number of individuals attended REDD+ consultations (sex disaggregated, if available), national REDD+ strategy was finalised, government formally adopted national REDD+ related policy/s, NFMS was established, partnership agreement with private sector association signed
 - National REDD+ Secretariat effectively coordinating REDD+ readiness activities at the national level and providing oversight in 3 participating States (Cross River, Nasarawa and Ondo)
 - The REDD+ Strategy development in progress drawing from the framework Strategy developed with UN-REDD funding.
 - Structural planning for REDD+ implementation in other regions of Nigeria ongoing.

3. What were the main REDD+ readiness-related challenges and/or problems during the last year?

- For example, lack of engagement from key stakeholders, political barriers, limited funding
 - There has been limited capacity on procurement which often resulted in delays. This is being addressed by mobilizing an additional procurement officer to support the National REDD+ Secretariat (NRS) and may not seriously impact the remaining project implementation.
 - Lack of training/capacity enhancement for REDD+ Secretariat Staff.
 - Lack of incentives for REDD+ Secretariat Staff.
 - National and State REDD+ Secretariats would need to mobilize sufficient resources to cover the key activities envisaged under the piloting phase of REDD+ implementation in Nigeria which cannot be covered by the FCPF grant.
 - The capacities of state multi-stakeholder REDD+ structures remain weak and need to be strengthened to integrate REDD+ at community and landscape level and to ensure that there is a closer linkage between the National REDD+ Secretariat and the State REDD+ actors.
 - Pilot testing REDD+ programme implementation could be problematic if adequate funding is not mobilized and state government properly involved in providing political, technical and financial backstopping and support.

- Engagement and capacity strengthening of 3 additional States in the REDD+ process.
- Development, archiving and airing of REDD+ documentary.
- Setting up of the FGRM Mechanism.
- In-depth analysis to better integrate gender into REDD+.
- Building capacity of local women on business principles and value chain management as related to REDD+.
- Mainstreaming REDD+ in national development plans, NDC implementation plan, Nigeria Green Bond, private sector and multilateral financing.
- Data collection for NFI in additional States.
- Support for system strengthening, including software needs and upgrade for MRV.
- Development of National Forest Monitoring System (NFMS).
- Acquisition of data for Multiple Benefits analysis and mapping.
- Development of Safeguards Information System.
