# FCPF Gender Achievements in FY17

## Monitoring and Evaluation at the Fund level:

- Gender-disaggregated data is now integrated into the **new M&E Framework**, with impact, outcome, and output indicators. These indicators would be used as a milestone for reporting.
- All FCPF frameworks and templates have been analyzed through a gender 'lens,' and gender-specific indicators have been mainstreamed into Readiness and ER program design.
- A gender checklist has been prepared to guide REDD+ countries as they move forward with ER program implementation.



# FCPF Gender Achievements in FY17

The following countries benefited from gender funding in FY17:

- **Ghana:** Gender analysis (GA) was conducted in the cocoa farming sector, capacity-building on gender and safeguards was also conducted, to provide technical assistance into the Ghana Cocoa Forest REDD+ Programme.
- **Mexico:** GA in the ER program area explored approaches to trigger behavioral change, and address gender gaps in NRM activities in rural areas. The ASA provides country stakeholders recommendations for improving gaps in economic opportunities, access to and control over assets through a GAP.
- **Nepal:** An inception workshop with the National REDD+ Implementation Center was conducted. Through this collaboration, a GA in the ER-PD program area was conducted, the GAP will be mainstreamed in Nepal's ER-PD and showcased in the upcoming CF meeting.
- **Vietnam:** Provided capacity-building for ethnic minority women. GA was conducted as a part of the SESA process, with a focus on the ER program area. GAP was drafted as a part of the ESMF for the ER-PD.



# FY17 Achievements: Knowledge, Learning & Sharing

- Three gender knowledge sessions were held at the last PC meeting in Lao, PDR in collaboration with PROFOR and FIP.
- Focused on sharing lessons and examples of gender-responsive practices, activities, policies, strategies, and actions in relation to initiatives in forest landscapes.
- Demonstrated that there are many countries making great efforts to integrate and include women in REDD+ processes. Examples from Lao, Vietnam, Mozambique, Guatemala, Mexico, Nepal, Peru, and Togo.
- **Products:** Detailed Summary of Gender Sessions and all presentations are online (FCPF, CIF, PROFOR websites). “Being inspired by gender actions in forest landscapes around the world” by P. Kristjanson (PROFOR) with inputs from FCPF team members.
- The team conducting the Mexico Gender Analysis was asked to present the full study and findings at the 2018 Bank Land and Poverty Conference.



# FY17 Achievements: Communications

- In Togo, Le Consortium Femmes REDD+ Togo, a women's national platform uses social media as a means for addressing gender gaps in climate change and REDD+.
- The innovative feature piece was published on the Bank website and republished on multiple outlets such as: *Medium*, *AllAfrica*, *ModernDiplomacy*, and *Togo's Official Newspaper*.
- The story was also selected by the Gender CCSA as a part of the overall WB's Gender CCSA social media package for 2018 International Women's Day, and shared with all web editors across the Bank.
- The Mexico gender analysis was featured by the Bank as a "Today story."
