

Consultation, participation and outreach

- Approval of the National Strategy on Forest for Sustainable Growth (ENBCS) under Ministerial Resolution No. 293/19
- A <u>proposal for a Decree</u> with the aim of ensuring that key institutions are involved on the execution of the Implementation Plan after project closure.

- ENBCS has 7 strategic measures, and 3 cross-cutting measures.
- Validation process 306 representatives (43% women) of 120 institutions (public and private sectors, civil society, Indigenous Peoples, farmers communities, academia and the financial sector).
- <u>Implementation Plan is in final validation stage</u>
- SESA and ESMF under review of REDD+ roundtable

Participation of Indigenous Peoples and other stakeholders on the consultation processes

- The Stakeholder Engagement Plan has been continuously. Notably, the SESA provided the most recent inputs.
 The ESMF includes messages and lesson learned from all participatory activities. Includes a section to improve the participation of various groups.
- Contributions to the REDD+ Strategy were received through an on-line <u>citizen consultation</u>, open to the public for 21 days, through the MADES website.
- Indigenous Peoples are represented, as full members, in the REDD+ Roundtable and the National Commission on Climate Change.
- One of the **main lessons learned** is the need to adapt the methodology for stakeholder consultations to enable effective engagement (i.e. for Indigenous Peoples, youth).
- Working sessions with **Indigenous Peoples have been extremely enriching.** Allowed integration of important concepts in relation to forests, benefits for ecosystems and people, and the importance of participation of women in these spaces.



Component 3: Forest Reference Emission levels

3a Improved subnational capacity for REDD+ implementation

- <u>Forest Reference Emissions Level</u> submitted in 2016 (national level; gross emissions from deforestation)
- Project supported the development of the REDD+ Technical Annex. Submitted to the UNFCCC in 2018, as part of the <u>2nd BUR 2</u>
- During the year 2020 a <u>Second REDD+ Technical</u>
 <u>Annex 2017-2018</u> is being developed. Will be included in Paraguay's 3rd BUR to be submitted on 2021. Additional product of the project.

Component 4: National Forest Monitoring System





- The National Forest Monitoring System has been created within the framework of Law 6256/18
- This Law also prohibits the transformation and conversion of forest-covered areas in the Eastern Region.
- The project supported the promulgation of Decree 3.246 which creates an inter-agency cooperation between MADES and Forestry Institute for the NFMS
- Support provided on capacity building and provision of systems/equipment to the institutions involved (MADES/INFONA) for the generation and validation of information linked to forest monitoring (including FI).



Component 4: National Forest Monitoring System





- 2019 <u>MADES Safeguards working group</u> was established. Representatives of the National Climate Change Directorate and the Indigenous Affairs Unit. Group created to build consensus on the update of the SIS, GRM, SESA and ESMF, prior to socializing them with the CNCC, the REDD+ Roundtable and/or key actors.
- The most recent design of the SIS, and revised versions of SESA and ESMF were presented to the REDD+ Roundtable in August 2020 for consideration, prior submission to the CNCC for approval in October 2020.
- Paraguay submitted a <u>First Sol</u> on safeguards
- Final design and set up of SIS expected until December 2020, as well as a revised process for successive Sol.

5. Challenges and key risks

- Frequent changes in relevant government authorities and focal points
- Key processes run by understaff units within relevant government entities
- Lengthy and costly process of participation (still not enough)
- Resistance from productive sector to engage on sustainable practices
- Effective engagement of other government sectors (indigenous affairs, planning, agriculture)
- COVID-19
 - Impose challenges for effective engagement of stakeholders
 - Bring a sense of urgency for investment in production economic recovery
