

R-PP Quality Improving, But Enhanced Guidelines Requested



- 18 R-PPs submitted to date. R-PP is working. Lots of evolution occurring
- PC6 in Guyana requested revised R-PP template, and further harmonization with UN-REDD NPD documents
- ~ 200 comments received: countries, observers, WB, UN-REDD, TAP
- Template now posted as draft for comments

Overview of Revised Template Draft (1)

- Used tables of comments received to edit every component.
- Structure constant. Only change: Consultations split into 1b and 1c
- New "Country Submission template": version without the guidelines a country would use to submit its R-PP
- Enhanced guidelines, especially for :
 - 1b: Information Sharing and Early Dialogue with Key Stakeholder Groups
 - 2c: Implementation Framework
 - 2d and other components: conducting social and environmental assessment integral to REDD-plus Readiness process (including environmental and social safeguarding during <u>both</u> the *preparation* and the *implementation* of the REDD-plus strategy)
 - 3: Develop a Reference Level or Scenario
- Package of revised template (Ver. 5) plus Stakeholders Guidance annex provides guidance for \$200k formulation grants.

Overview of Revised Template Draft (2)

- Added emerging Good Practices
- Added the standard for each component
- UN-REDD Programme & FCPF being integrated into single common template: underway, continuing.
- Governance considerations more clearly addressed
- REDD-plus activities noted where needed enhancement of carbon stocks, etc.)
- 5 Annexes attached or due soon
- Sum: Enhanced guidelines for challenging components, mainstreamed SESA, and converging rapidly with UN-REDD.

Component 1: Organize and Consult (1)

- Former component 1b Consultation and Participation, now split into two subcomponents. Reflects country experience:
 - Information sharing needs to proceed consultations, since REDD strategy not well developed, and funding not available yet
 - Consultation plan is developed in the R-PP, but only implemented during the R-PP implementation phase
- 1b: Information Sharing and Early Dialogue with Key Stakeholder Groups (new title)
 - Lays foundation for consultation process during R-PP implementation, in component 1c

Component 1: Organize and Consult (2)

- 1c: Consultation and Participation Process:
 - Essentially is previous 1b text
- Note: Only a single consultation and participation plan and process is required, that meets needs of 1c as well as under SESA
- UN-REDD text is under development to address its needs.
- Mechanisms for grievance, conflict resolution and redress must be established and accessible.
- Guidelines note on Stakeholder Engagement included as Annex B (joint UN-REDD and FCPF)

Component 2: Prepare the REDD+ Strategy (1)

- 2a: Strengthened guidelines for Quick Assessment analysis of deforestation drivers, critical for developing REDD+ Strategy
 - New ToR annex available shortly
- 2b: Encourages countries to establish a process for development of REDD+ Strategy
 - Also explains how social and environmental considerations should be incorporated into the design of national REDD+ strategy
- 2c: Implementation Framework: additional guidelines

Component 2: Prepare the REDD+ Strategy (2)

- 2d & other components: Mainstreams considerations of social and environmental aspects throughout R-PP. Elaborates in component 2d the development of Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF)
 - Removes previous duplication, by clarifying that social and environmental assessment process is integral to REDD+ readiness
 - Annex C: Generic Guidelines for Draft Input for ESMF ToRs
 - Annex D: Summary of How Integrated SESA Will Be Included in REDD+ Readiness Package
 - For inclusion in later Readiness Package, but highlights what countries would need to do during Readiness implementation, to prepare

Component 3: Reference Level or Scenario

- New title, to reflect evolving UNFCCC terminology, and UN-REDD usage
- Terminology still under discussion, but in this draft, country can use terminology it prefers:
 - "Reference Emissions Level" (for gross emissions), and
 - "Reference Level" (for *net* emissions and uptakes); or
 - "Reference Scenario" (previous generic term, or for projections)
- Provides additional guidelines on what to produce in R-PP writing stage
- Recognizes a stepwise approach may make sense, since methods, UNFCCC negotiations, etc. are still evolving

Component 4: Design a Monitoring System

- Considers use of stepwise approach while methods and climate policy evolve
- Encourages linkage of MRV design to assessment of drivers of deforestation, REDD+ strategy, and reference level components
- Urges countries to develop MRV system capable of assessing REDD+ activities, multiple benefits, and addressing governance



Components 5 (Schedule & Budget) and 6 (Program Monitoring)

- Guidelines and good practices added
- Component 6 (Monitoring & Evaluation) is mandatory
- Encourages use of independent monitoring of budget and schedule performance.
