Session 2a. Update on Carbon Fund Progress Since CF24

Background: The FMT will present progress made under the Carbon Fund since CF24, including updates on social inclusion, gender, private sector engagement, capacity building, MRV, communications, knowledge management, CORSIA, Auction Mechanism and ICROA.

Session 4a. Creation of a stand-alone FCPF Program/Standard

Background: As a result of the application to CORSIA and the prospect of generating Excess ERs that can be available to carbon markets (through the auction mechanism), the FCPF Methodological

Framework and other requirements (i.e. FCPF Requirements) have become increasingly regarded as a Standard that is used by the WB to certify ER Credits issued under a GHG Program (i.e. FCPF Program). There is the interest that the FCPF continues as a stand-alone Standard and Program that enables REDD Countries to generate ER Credits that are eligible for RBCF under CERF. This session will present the proposal to create a stand-alone FCPF Program/Standard and the next steps for its development.
